## Help to reduce your fuel bills

If you're worried about rising fuel bills this winter, there's help and advice available.

## Keep warm

Heating your home to at least 18°C (65°F) is important for your health and immune system - especially if you are 65 or over, have reduced mobility, or an existing health condition such as heart or lung disease.

Follow these tips from the NHS to keep warm and well at home:

- keep your bedroom at 18°C all night if you can and keep bedroom windows closed
- use a hot water bottle or electric blanket in bed, but don't use both at the same time
- have at least one hot meal a day
- have hot drinks regularly
- draw curtains at dusk and keep doors closed to block out draughts

# Check if you qualify for a discount



- You may be able to get £140 off your electricity bill this winter with a **Warm Home Discount.**Or you may be able to get the discount on your gas bill, if your supplier provides you with gas and electricity. Visit www.gov.uk/the-warm-home-discount-scheme or call 0800 731 0214.
- You could get a Winter Fuel Payment of between £100 and £300 if you were born before 27 September 1955. If you get the state pension, you'll usually receive the payment automatically. Visit www.gov.uk/winter-fuel-payment or call 0800 731 0160.
- If there's a seven day period of very cold weather (0°C or below), you may be entitled to a **Cold** Weather Payment of £25 if you're on certain benefits. Visit www.gov.uk/cold-weather-payment

#### Do you worry about keeping your children active and well fed in the school holidays?

The Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme is free and offers kids fun daily activities and a tasty, healthy meal. The next one will be in the Christmas holidays.

The programme – supported by Marcus Rashford - is for children and young people aged 4 to 16 in full-time education who receive benefitsrelated free school meals.

Activities include fun multi-sports, dance and drama, and take place at various locations through the city.

From cooking to crafts and skateboarding skills, HAF is a chance for children to try something new and make friends.

## Stay safe and look out for others

Coronavirus remains a serious health risk. With it now circulating alongside flu and colds, this winter may be difficult for many.

We all need to keep doing what we can to protect ourselves and keep cases down, but please also consider the people you come into contact with and do what you can to protect them too.

- Get your first and second vaccine as soon as possible, and your booster if you're eligible – book online, call 119 or visit a walk-in session
- Find out if you're eligible for a free flu vaccine and book an appointment with your GP or pharmacy
- Take symptom-free tests regularly and report your results – order online, collect from Jubilee Library or Hove Town Hall, or pick up from pharmacies
- Book a PCR test if you have any symptoms, are a close contact or if you test positive on a lateral flow test, and isolate if required
- Wear a face covering in busy places and on public transport
- Meet outside where possible, or let fresh air in
- Wash your hands regularly

Community rooms at the block of flats in Albourne Close have been renovated to provide a new community kitchen and meeting space/classroom.

The work was carried out as part of our **'Hidden Homes**' project in Housing which is making good use of empty or 'hidden' spaces in council-owned property.

The facilities are being leased to East Brighton Food Co-op, which was set up last year by volunteers to make it easier for local people to get fresh, nutritious food.

The Food Co-op is planning a range of activities for all ages, with lots of opportunities for socialising and learning new skills.

Bryan Coyle, from the Food Co-op, said: "It's all very exciting, the council has been amazing and we are delighted with the new facilities.

"It's a great place for the community to meet up and share the love of good food and good company."

# Conference focus on becoming carbon neutral

Carbon Neutral 2030

'Becoming a carbon neutral city by 2030' was the theme of annual Citywide Conference for tenants and leaseholders in September.

The conference was organised by residents and chaired by Chris El-Shabba, a tenant representative from Whitehawk.

Chris said: "By listening and working together, we can do the best we can for tenants and leaseholders in the city."

Councillor Siriol Hugh-Jones, co-chair of the Housing Committee, highlighted action the council is taking to cut carbon emissions and make homes more energy efficient.

This will include putting solar panels on hundreds more council homes and installing our first ground source heat pump system to heat new flats being built in Victoria Road, Portslade.

Rachel Sharpe, Executive Director for Housing, Neighbourhoods & Communities, gave updates from across housing services and residents put questions to her and other speakers.

A range of speakers featured local community projects helping the environment, and shared ideas for making a difference.

For example, Brighton Permaculture Trust is planting fruit trees and creating community orchards on estates around the city. (Visit www.brightonpermaculture.org.uk)

# Electric vehicles to travel around the city

As part of ongoing action to reduce emissions by 2030, the repairs service is now using six electric powered vans to travel around the city.

We also have two electric bikes which our electrical supervisors are using to carry out their tasks.

## New homes update

New homes are taking shape as part of action to provide more housing in the city.

Work is underway on 42 new council flats in Victoria Road, Portslade, behind Portslade Town Hall.

The steel frame for the development was erected in November. The homes, a mix of one, two and three-bedroom flats, are due to be completed next autumn.

## Homes for Brighton & Hove

A total of 242 low cost homes are being built in Coldean Lane, Coldean, in a development by Homes for Brighton & Hove - a partnership of the council and housing association, the Hyde Group.

And 104 homes are being built in Wellington Road, Portslade, on the site of the former Belgrave Day Centre.

The developments will both include one, two and three-bedroom flats. There will also be some studio flats in Wellington Road.

The homes are due to be ready early in 2023. Half will be available for rent from the council, the others will be available to buy through a shared ownership scheme with Hyde.

The development will be the first new council housing project in the city with a ground source heat pump system to provide heating and hot water for residents, as part of action to cut carbon emissions.

Other sustainability features will include solar panels and high levels of insulation.

There will also be a communal garden with a small orchard, plus living green walls watered with recycled rainwater.

The development is part of our New Homes for Neighourhoods building programme.

# Moulsecoomb housing and community hub proposals

Plans are progressing for a new community hub and more than 200 council homes on a number of underused sites in Moulsecoomb.

The proposals are to develop a community building and new homes on land currently used by the Moulsecoomb north and south hubs, and the 67 Centre and the surrounding area.

In early 2020, we held a series of 'planning for real' sessions, using a 3D model of the area to give a hands-on way for residents to have their say. More than 200 residents attended and gave constructive feedback on the proposals and any potential concerns.

Feedback was given on the facilities and activities residents would like to see in the hub, the type of housing, transport and the public realm.

This was fed in and a number of changes were made to the progressing designs, including moving the community hub into the heart of the development.

We've gained approval from the Housing Committee to go to the planning stage and aim to submit the application early next year.

## Turning heads at Holmstead!

A vibrant mural has transformed a block of flats in Upper Lewes Road, Brighton.

Residents at Holmstead flats came up with the idea of fencing in refuse and recycling bins to prevent fly-tipping and commissioned a colourful mural to deter graffiti.

They got approval and funds from the Estate Development Budget to carry out the project.

The result is an eyecatching artwork of hummingbirds which is proving popular with Holmstead residents and passers-by.

Local artists Mowgli and Humor painted the mural and residents were involved in the choice of the design. Even the bins have been painted to blend into the background!

Mo Ali from Holmstead Residents' Association said: "The feedback has been fantastic. The mural adds a splash of colour and brightens up people's day."

## Creative idea from residents

Another mural is being planned nearby for a wall on the edge of the Sylvan Hall estate.

Local residents, led by the Round Hill Society, are behind the project which aims to help prevent graffiti on a long stretch of wall in Upper Lewes Road and Wakefield Road, Brighton.

They are gathering views from

the local community and working with artists on a design for the mural, which will include natural Sussex features and wildlife.

The cost of the mural will be funded from the Environmental Improvement Budget and work is likely to start in the new year.

## **Natural wonders from our city**

As most of our wildlife tucks up for winter or migrates off to warmer climes, it's the perfect time to see starlings amass in whirling, twirling, twisting aerial displays.

These gatherings are called a murmuration and are a hypnotic natural spectacle, understood to help confuse and protect against predators.

They happen just before dark during the dusky winter skies, when large numbers of the birds take to the air before coming into mass roost – safety and warmth in numbers.

We are lucky to share our city with starlings, a chatty and sociable bird that makes a repertoire of calls from the tops of blocks of flats, or when hopping about feeding on the ground in communal grass areas across our city. Their feathers are a beautiful iridescence changing from purples to greens as the sunlight catches. Keep your eyes out for their magical movements this winter.

Healthwalks are a great way to get active and improve health and wellbeing.

Regular walks are held throughout the year, varying from under a mile, to up to five miles in local parks and green spaces.

# How we've been doing

Here are the highlights of our performance over the last quarter...



#### **Repairs and improvements**

The proportion of 'Decent Homes' increased from 91.9% to 92.9%, since kitchen and bathroom replacements resumed under new contracts.



#### **Customer services**

Housing Customer Services dealt with an average of 80 phone calls and 86 emails per working day. The most common queries were about the housing waiting list, residents' parking and communal areas of council estates.



#### **Anti-social behaviour**

At the end of September, our officers were working with 158 victims/witnesses and 125 perpetrators of anti-social behaviour.



#### **Estates Service**

July to September 2021

The team completed 99% of cleaning tasks, up from 96% previously, including handles and rails in common ways.



#### **Tenancy management**

We've helped 31 people to keep their tenancies which were at risk. This included helping vulnerable tenants with arranging benefit claims, repairs, and care packages, as well as decluttering their homes.



### **Moving home**

We let 103 homes, including 5 new homes. This is higher than during the same period last year, when 67 homes were let. We are taking on additional resources so more empty homes can be repaired ready for letting.

## Christmas fire safety advice

#### Take care with candles

Don't leave candles burning when you're not watching and always double-check they are completely out.

If you're using candles, make sure they are on a heat-proof surface, in a proper candle holder so they don't fall over, out of reach of children and pets, out of draughts, and away from curtains, furniture, cards, decorations or anything else which could catch fire.

**Fairy lights and heaters** that you bring out for only a few weeks a year can be a fire risk.

Check the wiring is intact, make sure plug sockets are not overloaded and don't leave items on unattended.

## Keep communal areas and common ways clear in

blocks of flats. Anything left in common ways poses a potential fire and smoke hazard and can block escape routes. Just a reminder that at Christmas, this also means that decorations and wreaths cannot be hung on the outside of flat doors.

## **Gritters ready for action**

Keeping the city moving safely during the winter is a priority, and gritters are on standby 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

The council's winter highways service includes salt gritting, snow ploughing, pavement clearing and filling grit bins for residents to use.

During severe weather we try to keep clear all major roads

and prioritise bus routes and access to local hospitals.

## Christmas & New Year recycling & refuse

As Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day all fall at the weekend, kerbside recycling and refuse collections will be on your usual days.

Please leave your recycling and refuse out by 6am on your scheduled day.

Garden waste collections stop over Christmas and new year. The last collection will be on Friday 17 December, with the service resuming from Monday 3 January.

To check your collection days in 2022 and download your collection calendar if you have fortnightly recycling, visit www.brighton-hove.gov.uk/cityclean and put in your postcode.

## Recycle this Christmas!

#### **Christmas trees**

Christmas tree recycling sites across the city will be open from **Monday 27 December** until **Monday 10 January.** Please remove all decorations and the pot before leaving your tree. To find your nearest site, visit **www.brighton-hove.gov.uk/christmas-tree-recycling.** 

Don't leave trees on the pavement, road or beside a communal bin as this is fly-tipping and you could be fined.



Please only recycle wrapping paper and plain Christmas cards - foil or paper covered in glitter can't be recycled.

Flatten all your cardboard boxes and paper bags to make space in your recycling bins and boxes.

#### **Batteries**

Recycle used batteries at your local supermarket or our household recycling sites.

Please do not put batteries in your household waste or recycling.

#### Food and drink

Plastic bottles can go straight in your recycling box or bin, washed and squashed.

Rinsed drink cans and food tins can also go in your recycling, along with egg boxes, cardboard sleeves for food packaging and all tin biscuit boxes.

Please keep all glass bottle/ jars in a separate recycling box so glass doesn't contaminate the other materials.

## Household recycling sites

You can also take your recycling to a recycling point or one of the city's two household recycling sites.

## Recycle your old tech!

If you have old electrical items you no longer use, recycle them through Tech-Takeback.

Almost 27,000 electrical items have been collected since the service launched its RevaluElectricals doorstep collection service last November.

The service collects devices such as mobile phones, computers and small appliances in a fully electric van with the aim of giving items a second life.

Donations are securely wiped clean of data before being refurbished and prepared for re-use or recycled.

A total of 5,463 items have been redistributed, including more than 2,000 household electricals going to new homes and 294 laptops to schools, charities and families.
