Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

NOTICE is hereby given that Brighton & Hove City Council (“the Council”) has on 22nd April 2026 made the Orders named below under the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended which when it comes into operation on 27th April 2026 will amend existing descriptions on electric vehicle charging points with no alterations on ground as detailed below:

Brighton & Hove Various Controlled Parking Zones Consolidation Order 2024 Amendment Order No.5 2026 (ref: TRO-05a-2026)

Changing existing electric vehicle charging points to electric vehicle charging points 8am-8pm - Permit holders Only Maximum stay 4 hours (no return within 4 hours) in:

- Zone A – Robertson Road
- Zone I – Queensway
- Zone J – Mayo Road
- Zone S – Bernard Place
- Zone V – Islingword Road

Changing existing electric vehicle charging points to electric vehicle charging points 8am-8pm – Shared Permit or Paid Parking Maximum stay 4 hours (no return within 4 hours) in:

- Zone A – Wincombe Road
- Zone H – Arundel Road & Portland Place
- Zone M – Adelaide Crescent South & Lansdowne Place
- Zone N – Eaton Road & Tisbury Road
- Zone R – Princes Avenue & Stoneham Road
- Zone Y – Ditchling Road
- Zone Z – Kings Road

Changing existing electric vehicle charging points to electric vehicle charging points 8am-8pm - Maximum stay 4 hours (no return within 4 hours) in:

- Zone 12 – Withdean Road

Brighton & Hove Outer Areas (Waiting, Loading and Parking) and Cycle Lanes Consolidation Order 2024 Amendment No.5 2026 (ref: TRO-05b-2026)

Introduce new electrical vehicle charging points 8am-8pm - Maximum stay 4 hours (no return within 4 hours) in:

- Carden Avenue, Downland Road, Hollingbury Rise, Moulsecoomb Way & Orchard Road

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirements of the Act or of any instrument made under it have not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, apply to the High Court for that purpose.
